Program Summary

This 4-day summer program will introduce participants to the coastal, marine and island environments of Hong Kong and the wild and wonderful creatures that are found there. Participants will learn about the importance of these local ecosystems creating an awareness and understanding of our natural wonders. Helping to inspire the students to become better guardians of our oceans, highlighting the threats that face them and the importance of conservation.
